Our aspiring Olympians were pretty evenly split between male and female, and ranged in age from 29 to 72. We hope they will all be encouraged to take up the sport.

A keen rower from Newark, 14-year-old Vicky Lyon has made an amazing recovery from brain damage after a car accident in November 2015.

Initially paralyzed and unable to walk, Vicky has undergone

treatment at Tadworth Court, a rehabilitation centre in Surrey run by the Children's Trust, the UK's leading charity for children with brain injury.

Her parents were keen to see if Vicky could start rowing again, and get back into the sport she loves.
